DOCUMENATION GUIDE FOR OXYGEN

Diagnosis and Symptoms

Oxygen therapy is covered for acute OR chronic conditions, and for short-term OR long-term use, when the patient's oxygen levels reach 88% or below.

Testing

❖ When discharging from the hospital or SNF the O2 test must be the <u>last test done</u> prior to discharge and must be within 48 hours of discharge.

Test Method I – At rest on room air – It must be specified that the test was done "At rest on room air"

Test Method II – During Exercise - Please document the following three tests:

- 1. At rest on room air showing non-qualifying results.
- 2. During activity on room air showing desaturation at or below 88%.
- 3. <u>During activity on oxygen</u> showing improvement.

Test Method III – During Sleep with or without OSA – If the patient has OSA the test must be performed in an in-lab titration. If the patient does NOT have OSA you can order an overnight pulse oximetry test. Please call Fredericksburg Medical Equipment at 830-990-4775 to set up testing.

Medical Records

The medical records must document:

- The patient's diagnosis and symptoms
- Test results
- Documentation that the physician has reviewed the oxygen testing and made the clinical decision to prescribe oxygen therapy and must include:
 - Liter flow
 - o Route of administration (nasal cannula, oxygen mask, CPAP bleed in, etc.)
 - Duration of use (continuous or nocturnal)
